

Dear Parents / Carers,

As the summer term progresses, we look forward to starting some exciting outdoor improvements on the site! One of the long-neglected areas is the school pond. With some clearance of the area and new fencing and pond-viewing platform, it will become a fantastic area for outdoor learning for children at both schools.

At the junior school, we also look forward to seeing our 'log tangle' construction starting. This is being sited on the grassed area between Year 4 and the playground, where the modular classroom was last year. Work on this is starting today so we should start to see it taking shape soon. The amphitheatre, close by, will also be replaced by the same company.

The copse, between the junior school and the playground, has recently been fenced and gated. This will be developed into a quiet zone for break times over the next few weeks as the weather hopefully improves.

We are planning to improve the outdoor area and would like to request donations of large plant pots of various shapes and sizes as well as cuttings of ferns and Hosta to propagate. If you have large plants of these to donate, we would be grateful but will also be happy with cuttings.

Infant School Extension to School Day Consultation

Thank you to all who returned the survey in relation to the 15-minute extension to the infant school day. The governing body have now agreed that <u>from September 2024</u>, the infant school day will be as follows:

- Doors open 8.45am (which means registration will be at 08.55am)
- End of day 3.20pm

This means that the junior school and infant school will still have a staggered start and end to the school day, ensuring families with children at both schools will have sufficient time at both ends of the school day as well as maintaining the safe flow of people on site.

Please ensure that your child attends regularly and on time. We will inform you on a termly basis about your child's attendance record, regardless of whether they have had absence or not. If any absence reaches a concerning level, you will receive

If your child is absent, you must:

- Contact the relevant school as soon as possible on the first day of absence by phoning the office.
- Send a note in on the first day they return with an explanation of the absence you must do this even if you have already telephoned us (this can be by email).

If your child is absent, we will:

- Telephone you on the first day of absence if we have not heard from you This is because we have a duty to ensure your child's safety as well as their regular school attendance.
- Invite you to discuss the situation with a member of the Senior Leadership Team if absences persist.
- Refer the matter to the Hampshire County Council's Attendance Legal Panel if absence is unauthorised and falls below 90%.

You may have noticed that the Government are focusing on school attendance as school absence rates have increased nationally. This is via the 'Moments Matter, Attendance Counts' campaign.

Schools, nationally, are experiencing the number of persistently absent pupils increasing. This is when attendance drops below 90%. In 2018/19, just 40% of persistently absent (PA) children in KS2 achieved expected KS2 standards, compared with 84% of pupils who were regular attenders.

School attendance however is important for more than just attainment: regular school attendance can facilitate positive peer relationships, which is a protective factor for mental health and wellbeing.



Reminder about earrings and PE

Hampshire Outdoors – Safety in PE and Sport PE guidance states the following:



- Jewellery (earrings, bangles, etc.) should not be worn to school in the first place.
- Where jewellery is worn it must be removed for physical activity.
- If under exceptional circumstances it cannot be removed (e.g. cultural practice or newly pierced ears), the risk of injury should be reduced where it is practicable to do so. This could be by:
 - bracelets being secured by the use of a wrist sweatband.
 - o studs being secured by the use of micropore tape.
 - o using tape or masking tape (not elastoplast or sellotape).

In these circumstances care must be taken to effectively cover the spike at the back of the ear lobe.

Similar action may be agreed when a child or young person has had their ears newly pierced, but only for a short, agreed period such as six full weeks.


Recycling – a message from the Eco Councils
